## *Neo-Extractivism" in Latin America: A New Model of Rentism?*

This presentation addresses the concept of "new or neo-extractivism" and the changing role of the state in Latin America. Looking at a number of social and economic indicators, we observe, even after considering differences between countries, (neo-)extractivism is not a temporary economic strategy in the region. Instead, it exhibits features of a consolidated development project. Empirical evidence from the region shows the fundamental implications of resource-based development paths in politics, social relations and territorial orders. To grasp these implications conceptually, we argue for a shift in theoretical perspectives, related to the link between development and resource extraction. Key elements for such a shift are to be found in recent studies in rentier theory.

## Prof. Hans-Jürgen Burchardt

Hans-Jürgen Burchardt is Director of the International Center for Development and Decent Work (since 2009) and Full Professor of International and Intersocietal Relations at the University of Kassel (since 2005). Also, since 2007 he is the Spokesperson of the doctoral program Global Social Policies and Governance at the University of Kassel. Prior join the University of Kassel, Prof. Burchardt was Substitute Professor of Political Science and head of the International Studies Program in Political Management at the University of Applied Sciences in Bremen (2004-2005) and Head of a research project on international social policy at the Institute of Ibero-American Studies (IIK) in Hamburg (2003-2005). His main research areas are North-South Relations, Ecological, Labour and Social Policy Regimes in International Perspective, Democracy and Social Inequality, Theory of Development and Development Politics, and Latin America.
