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## Letter from the President and the Director

The year 2021 was especially demanding for IBEI. The pandemic and its consequent conditions did not begin to subside until the end of the year, obliging us to move almost all activities for academic year 2020-2021 online – with all the challenges that entailed. Nevertheless, the academic course progressed normally and IBEI achieved all its teaching objectives, including all planned complementary activities. In the end, we were able to hold our graduation ceremony at the beginning of September, this time in person. We also included a special ceremony for graduates of the 2019–2020 academic year, who had been unable to celebrate their graduation at that time.

Throughout the course, the entire IBEI community, including teachers, researchers and administration staff, went above and beyond to ensure the quality of our educational programmes despite these adverse conditions, and to offer students a comprehensive learning experience in their chosen international studies fields. We would like to thank you wholeheartedly for your effort and dedication during this very trying period.

Beyond its educational offerings, the Institute also carried out a large part of its other academic and research activities virtually, including scientific seminars, academic debates, summer schools, researcher network meetings, and so forth. However, intellectual life and research activity never wavered. These remained vibrant and dynamic despite the limitations imposed by the pandemic.

In one of our most outstanding milestones of 2021, the CERCA network of the Government of Catalonia accepted IBEI as a research centre of excellence.

Even during this challenging year, the IBEI team acquired new competitive projects and launched numerous academic initiatives, including the new Erasmus Mundus programme coordinated by the University of Glasgow and the ETHNICGOODS project, an ERC Consolidator Grant that began in October 2020, during one of the most difficult moments of the pandemic.

Another major achievement of 2021 was the elaboration and approval of IBEI's new strategic plan for 2021–2025. Through a broad participatory process involving all groups connected to the Institute, we established new objectives and key strategies aimed at promoting IBEI as a high-level research centre and graduate school so the Institute can become one of the best in Europe in the near future. Together, we hope to consolidate and advance the quality of the Institute and reinforce our capacity to impact on public policy-making in IBEI's fields of expertise.





## IBEI celebrates the Graduation Ceremonies of the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 promotions



## **Job placement survey 2021**

The fifth job placement survey was carried out at IBEI from April to September 2021. The project aims to collect data systematically, every two years, on the employment situation of recent graduates (the last four cohorts) who respond to the survey. The main findings corroborate that graduates of IBEI Master's degrees work full-time in a wide spectrum of sectors.

**More than 86%** of IBEI alumni are currently employed.

**Between 78%** (Alumni academic year 2019-2020) and 90% (alumni academic year 2017-2018) would recommend the Master's programme.

**Between 70,8 %** (alumni academic year 2019-2020) and 87,1% (alumni academic year 2017-2018) are generally pleased to have done the Master's programme at IBEI.




## Expenditure 2020-2021






# Highlights

### IBEI hosted the 5th International **Conference on Public Policy (ICPP5)**


in Barcelona in 2021. Organized jointly with the International Public Policy Association (IPPA), the conference took place in July 2021 at the Ciutadella Campus of the Universitat Pompeu Fabra with simultaneous online access. The Universitat de Barcelona (UB), the Universitat Pompeu Fabra (UPF) and the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona (UAB) also collaborated in organizing this edition of the conference. Eminent researchers presented their work during plenary sessions and parallel sessions. In the evenings, participants enjoyed social events at world-class cultural venues. including a welcome drink on the terrace of the National Art Museum of Catalonia (MNAC) and a gala dinner at the Sant Pau Art Nouveau Site gardens.

IBEI predoctoral fellows received

outstanding awards and grants in 2021. Lewin Schmitt won the Global Challenges Talent Award of the "Talent Global Programme", jointly organized by CIDOB and Banco Sabadell Foundation. for his work What's in a tweet? Twitter's impact on public opinion and EU foreign affairs. Guillem Amatller was awarded a research grant from the Banco Sabadell Foundation to advance his PhD research on technological change and state power. Adrià Rivera Escartín won the 2021 Manuel Castillo Award, organized by the Universitat de València, for his scientific article Populist challenges to EU foreign policy in the Southern Neighbourhood: an informal and illiberal Europeanisation?, published in the Journal of European Public Policy.

**IBEI** and the Inter-American Institute for Cooperation on Agriculture (IICA) signed a Memorandum of **Understanding** that allows IBEI master's students to carry out professional internships both at IICA's headquarters in Costa Rica and at any of the institute's 35 locations in Latin America, the Caribbean and Spain. These internships provide an exceptional opportunity for those students interested in developing professional experience in an international organization specialized in agricultural development and rural well-being.

IBEI spearheaded the IDEES magazine special issue "China Before a World in Crisis", edited by the Centre d'Estudis de Temes Contemporanis. It is an in-depth analysis of Chinese reality from different angles and perspectives based on existing debates on the transformation and consolidation of China as a superpower. The special issue was coordinated by Pablo Pareja, Academic Co-coordinator of the Master's in Public Policy (Mundus MAPP), and Jacint Jordana, Director of IBEI


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IBEI organized several webinar series in partnership with other leading institutions. In collaboration with the Barcelona City Council, IBEI coordinated a webinar series on the Sustainable Development Goals' (SDGs) contribution to global governance. Leading scholars discussed how SDGs could be understood as a new mode of global governance and what lessons they could offer to improve it. IBEI also coordinated an online seminar series on US Foreign Policy as part of the joint programme on American politics and international security co-organised with the Institut d'Estudis Nord-americans (IEN).

**IBEI** welcomed Professor Anthony Bertelli as Senior Research Associate to run a research project funded by a European Research Council **(ERC) Advanced Grant.** The REPGOV project focusses on the relationship between democracy and administrative policymaking and aims to illustrate how the democratic value trade-offs. made by public administrators are an important missing link in contemporary discussions about the quality, and the nature, of representative government. Bertelli is Sherwin-Whitmore Professor of Public Policy and Political Science at Pennsylvania State University.
