



Erasmus Mundus Masters Program in Public Policy - MUNDUS MAPP

The Erasmus Mundus Masters Program in Public Policy (Mundus MAPP) is a two-year **joint degree program offered by a consortium of four top-ranked European universities**: Central European University, Institut Barcelona d'Estudis Internacionals, the International Institute of Social Studies of Erasmus University, and the University of York. The consortium offers **financial aid** for outstanding candidates.

The program consists of an integrated curriculum over two academic years, which provides a uniform core of policy studies as well as modules specific to particular consortium universities, drawn predominantly from the fields of International Relations, European Studies and Development Studies. Students can decide to spend the first academic year **in Vienna or the Hague** and the second in either **Barcelona or York** (UK). The four combinations (mobility tracks) allow students to specialize in Political Economy and Development; Governance and Development; European Public Policy or Global Public Policy. Each mobility track includes a field trip to relevant public sector organizations and an **internship**.

Graduates receive a joint Master of Arts degree in Public Policy which is **accredited in all four European countries the program operates in**, as well as (in the case of CEU track students) **in the USA**.

Mundus MAPP alumni work in governmental, non-governmental and charity organizations, academic institutions and multi-national corporations. Many has successfully applied for, and completed, PhD programs.

Application deadlines for 2020-2022:

November 25, 2019: for 'early bird' applicants who wish to receive an admissions decision by mid-December, and do not seek financial support from the program

January 30, 2020: for candidates applying for *financial aid*

April 15, 2020: for self-financing candidates who *require a study visa* (non-EU/EEA)

July 1, 2020: for self-financing candidates who *do not require a study visa* (EU/EEA)
