SUMMARY

Dr. García-Murillo research is on the impact of technology on policy and economic aspects of a country. Her present work focuses on the impact of technology on employment with a particular emphasis on the transition towards a more technology dependent society and the policies that will need to set in place to help people displaced by technology to find income alternatives. Her previous work has aimed to explain how information and communication technologies affect the creation of new businesses including the informal economy, instances of corruption and social unrest.

Her secondary research interests include theory development as a means to help young scholars to make contributions to their fields while understanding the work of previous scholars. In this area she has conducted workshops at conferences and universities. She also has a strong interest in international students and ways of helping them succeed in North American universities.
