MUNDUS MAPP

The **Erasmus Mundus Masters Program in Public Policy-Mundus MAPP (MUNMAPP)**, established in 2007, was selected for the prestigious *Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degree* grant under the **Erasmus+ Programme of the European Union** in the summer of 2017 for the third time.

Four European universities, each top-ranked for social sciences in the 2014-2015 *Times Higher Education World University Rankings*, jointly deliver Mundus MAPP: **Central European University in Budapest (Hungary)**, **Institut Barcelona d'Estudis Internacionals (Spain)**, the **International Institute of Social Studies of Erasmus University Rotterdam in The Hague (Netherlands)**, and the **University of York (UK)**. They offer an integrated curriculum of two academic years, a joint *Master of Arts degree in Public Policy* which is accredited in four European countries: Hungary, The Netherlands, Spain and the UK.

Building on Mundus MAPP's successful track record, this integrated curriculum provides a uniform core of policy studies as well as modules specific to particular mobility tracks, drawn predominantly from the fields of International Relations, European Studies and Development Studies. The four mobility tracks allow students to specialize in **Political Economy and Development, Governance and Development, European Public Policy** and **Global Public Policy**. Each mobility track includes a field trip to relevant public sector organizations and an internship.

Mundus MAPP alumni work in governmental, non-governmental and charity organizations, academic institutions and large businesses. Some have already completed or are in the process of completing PhD studies.
